

This year children made 'ketupat craft' as Hari Raya decoration. Yorkland children learnt on the meaning and how is Hari Raya or the festival of Eid celebrated worldwide. 

It constitutes good quality rice cooked in rich and organic virgin coconut oil with screw pandan leaves infused during the cooking process. The nasi lemak was served alongside fried anchovies, roasted organic peanuts, sliced organic cucumber, hard-boiled eggs and an addictive curry rice gravy. Later the nasi lemak was wrapped in a banana leaf on the brown paper background to enhance the aroma of the coconut rice.
