

### Yorkland Garden Grown Stories

Our little farmers were thrilled to harvest peanuts earlier this year after our bountiful long bean crop. While the exuberant bean vines crept rapidly from the garden beds, our peanut plants were just sprouting. Curious parents asked about the mysterious sprouts peeking out as the beans curtained the pillars.











When the leaves yellowed and wilted, our young growers knew it was time for peanut harvesting! Unlike many plants, peanuts flower above ground but bear fruit below. The teachers helped loosen the soil so the children could triumphantly pull up each entire plant.









The children scrubbed the freshly dug peanuts, rinsing them under running water to remove all traces of soil. After separating the nut pods from the plants, they gave the peanuts another wash in a basin, patting them dry.

















We boiled the fresh-picked peanuts right there in the garden. When ready, the children learned how to pinch each peanut at its seam, slurping out the salty brine before cracking open the shell to reveal the legume inside. The children were so proud to have grown and harvested their own tasty garden treats!
