

Year 1 Registration Now Open

Online registration for Year 1 is mandatory for all children entering the public school system. If your child is entering Year 1 in the 2026 academic session, please register soon.

Eligibility: Children born between 2nd January 2019 to 1st January 2020.

Important Dates:

Registration Opens: 1st March 2025Registration Closes: 30th April 2025

How to Register:

1. Visit the Online Portal:

 Access the Ministry of Education's Integrated System (MOEIS) at https://idme.moe.gov.my/login.

2. Create an Account:

New users need to register on the website.

3. Complete the Online Application:

- Fill in the required details about the child and parents/guardians.
- Upload necessary supporting documents, such as the child's birth certificate, parents' identification cards, and proof of residence.

4. Print the Application Form:

• After submission, print the completed application form.

• Submit Documents to the Selected School:

• Within the stipulated time, submit the printed application form and original documents to the chosen school for verification.

Note:

The registration process is not a guarantee of placement, as it depends on the availability of slots at the school. Parents may check if their child has been accepted at the school of their choice from 1st October to 31st October 2025 at https://idme.moe.gov.my/login. Appeals may also be done through the website during this period, and the updated status can be checked beginning 1st December 2025.
