They made their very own "chick cups" using bright yellow paper cups, getting everything ready for the much-anticipated Easter egg hunt. The children were especially excited to use their chick cups to collect all the eggs they would find!



To add even more festive spirit, the children also created adorable chick headbands. It was such a joy to see them proudly wearing their creations. They looked absolutely cute and full of Easter cheer!





These activities not only sparked their creativity but also built excitement and anticipation for the celebration. We are so proud of their efforts and loved seeing their happy smiles throughout the preparations.



The much awaited Easter celebration day began with a fun and creative Easter egg decorating activity. The children used colourful floral designs cut from thin napkins and carefully pasted them onto boiled eggs. They first spread glue over the eggs and then chose their favourite flower patterns to stick on.





The children enjoyed expressing their creativity through this activity, while carefully placement and handling without breaking the eggs.

Easter Egg Hunt Adventure



We took a slow walk to Taman Jajar, enjoying the sights along the way. The children were excited to spot a bull calmly eating grass in an open compound, and we also passed by many houses with fruit trees growing in their gardens. Some of the children even wondered aloud if it was the same bull we had seen last year, adding to the excitement of the walk.



It was a lovely opportunity for the children to observe nature and their surroundings before arriving at the park, where we had our circle time filled with cheerful Easter songs and poems. After that, the children enjoyed their snack time together.





Soon after, the moment they had been waiting for arrived, the Easter egg hunt! The children eagerly searched with wide, excited eyes for both the “big eggs” [boiled eggs wrapped in aluminium foil] and the “small eggs” [peanuts wrapped in colourful foil]. They ran around joyfully, filling up their chick paper cups and cheering with delight each time they found something.







After the excitement of the egg hunt winds down, the children slowly gather their chick paper cup, still buzzing with energy and proudly comparing their colourful treasures. Laughter fills the air as they count eggs and excitedly recount where they found the trickiest hidden eggs. But for most of them, the fun is far from over, the real highlight comes next.

As if by unspoken agreement, the children begin making their way toward the playground in the park at Taman Jajar. The moment they spot the swings, slides and climbing frames, their tiredness seems to vanish. Shoes kick off, chick paper cup are set aside and within seconds, the playground comes alive with movement and joy.





After enjoying their time at the playground, the children calmly walk back to the centre, chatting happily about their favourite moments. Once they arrive, they change out of their play clothes and freshen up with help from the teachers.



For lunch, the “big children” take part in peeling the hunted eggs. They carefully crack and remove the shells, showing patience and independence. Afterward, everyone sits together to enjoy their meal with the eggs, feeling relaxed and satisfied after a fun and active day.



After lunch, all the children gather together, settling down comfortably as they prepare to watch a special Easter puppet show. The room becomes quiet, filled with anticipation and excitement as the story begins.

The puppet show tells the story of a little girl who discovers a friendly caterpillar in her garden. She names him Mr. Caterpillar, and the two quickly become close friends, spending their days playing happily among the flowers and leaves. The children watch closely, smiling at the joyful moments they share.



One day, however, the little girl finds that Mr. Caterpillar is no longer moving. She becomes worried and thinks that her friend might be sick. The scene turns gentle and emotional as she stays by his side, unsure of what has happened.

As the story continues, with the help of Mr. Gnome and Mr. Rabbit, it is revealed that Mr. Caterpillar is not sick at all, he has formed a pupa, beginning his transformation. Mr. Gnome gently explains that this is a natural process, while Mr. Rabbit reassures the little girl not to worry. The children learn that this is part of nature, as the caterpillar prepares to become something new.



In the end, the little girl returns to the garden and is surprised and overjoyed to discover a beautiful butterfly. She soon realizes that it is her dear friend, transformed. The story ends on a happy note, showing how she finds her friend again, and their bond continues in a new and wonderful way.



Parents' Workshop – Facilitated by Jeanne Vijverberg



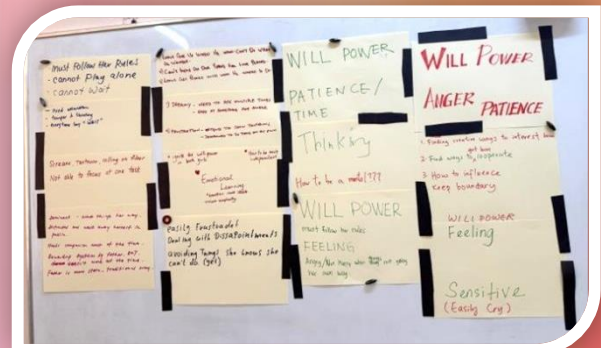
